

Parents should also be aware that there are a number of community forums on the topic of supporting public education and our students being held throughout the Monroe County area. Last week over 1,000 parents, teachers and students attended

an event held at Minerva DeLand School in Fairport that raised awareness of the consequences of the Governor's education agenda.



Parents, please remember to notify the health office at (585) 249-6607 if your child is going to be out of school for vacations, personal reasons, etc. as well as illness.

5th Grade Parents...

Scoliosis Screening:

Starting the week of March 9th, I will begin New York State mandated Scoliosis Screening for 5th grade students during Physical Education Classes. If I have received a Health Appraisal form for your child for 5th grade AND the doctor has documented a scoliosis screening, your student will not be screened at school. If my findings are not within New York State guidelines, you will be notified and asked to take your child to your own physician for further examination.

Immunization Requirement:

Please be aware that according to New York State guidelines, all children entering 6th grade in Septemer will need to have a shot for diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus (also called **Tdap**) as well as Varicella (Varivax which is the vaccine for chicken pox.) You will be receiving a notification letter from Bay Trail Health Office very soon. Please take the time to fill out this form and return it to Bay Trail Nurse's Office as soon as possible.



Change in Medication Administration in the Health Office:

Recently, out District Physician pulled her standing order allowing Nurses to apply Vaseline, Calamine, Aloe and Unscented lotion for dry skin as well as allowing administration of cough drops in the health office. This has always been a blanket order to help students get through their school day. The SED will not allow any medication, prescription or OTC (oral as well as topicals) to be ad-

ministered without a doctors order. So, going forward if your child needs to have lotion for their dry skin, Vaseline for their chapped lips or a cough drop at school, I will need to have a doctor's order and this includes oral medications (prescription or OTC) as well. We are presently working on altering our health appraisal forms to include MD permission to administer the things I've listed above. Thanks you for your patience in this matter.
