

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Notes From the Nurse's Office

FIFTH GRADE PARENTS: Please be aware that according to New York State guidelines all children entering 6th grade in September will need to have a **booster shot for diphtheria**, **pertussis and tetanus** (**also called Tdap**). If you haven't already, you will be receiving a letter from Bay Trail Health Office with more details. Please take the time to fill out this form and return to Bay Trail Nurse's Office as soon as possible. Feel free to call me with any questions.



SCOLIOSIS: The New York State required scoliosis screening for the fifth grade students is almost complete. Scoliosis is a side wards curvature of the spine. This screening is state mandated at the elementary level in 5th grade only. If my findings are not within the New York State guidelines, I will notify you. As always, thank you to Mrs. Stark and Mr. Solomon for their assistance with this process.



ATTENDANCE: Parents please remember to notify the health office if your child is going to be out of school for vacations, personal reasons, etc, as well as illness. Teachers, please remember if you receive an email or parent contact regarding a student absence, forward email or call health office with information.

CLOTHING: Clothing in good condition is needed to stock the Health Office for loan to children who have accidents resulting in wet or soiled clothes during the school day. At this time I am requesting boys sweat pants or elastic band athletic pants. Any size welcome, however I am in greatest need of larger sizes. If your child(ren) has out-grown some of these items, I would appreciate having them in my Health Office supply.



It is characterized by teamwork, speed, intricate formations and step sequences. Mirror Images is looking for skaters from USFS basic 4 to Senior level skaters to field their beginner to Collegiate level teams.

Competitions and ice shows keep the skaters busy throughout the skating season. The teams perform in the Thomas Creek FSC Show, skate at the Rochester American games and at other local exhibitions.
