Harris Hill's Community Project

It's the time of the year where we like to reflect on how lucky we are to be a part of the Harris Hill community and how we can give back to a part of the Rochester-area community who are less fortunate than we may be.

This year we have decided to support **Cameron Communities**, an urban outreach community center in downtown Rochester. They offer many services like after-school and summer programs for youths at risk, along with hot meal programs, an emergency food pantry and a clothing house that serves youths and adults.

Our community project will run from *Monday*, *November 30th through Friday*, *December 11th*. This is just TWO SHORT WEEKS! We are asking that different grade levels support different programs of the Cameron Communities.

- **Kindergarten/First Grade:** Children's warm clothing coats, sweaters, hats, gloves, mittens, scarves. These items can be for children of all ages and may be new or *gently* used.
- **Second/Third Grades:** School supplies-composition notebooks, folders, colored pencils, markers, scissors, glue.
- **Fourth/Fifth Grades:** Hygiene Items-shampoo/conditioner, soap, lotion, adult toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, shaving cream. These items can be full size or trial size.
- Faculty and Staff may align themselves with one of the groups above.

The 5th grade Student Connection Team will provide boxes to each cluster for their donations, and will pick up items daily. They will deliver all items collected to the Cameron Community and get a tour of the facilities on Tuesday, December 15th. We appreciate any support your family can give, but of course, you are not obligated to participate.

HEALTH APPRAISALS

I would like to once again say thank you to all parents/guardians who have turned in completed physical forms for the 2015-2016 school year. If your child is new to Harris Hill, or in 2nd or 4th grade, New York State requires that a physical form must be on file in the Health Office. This physical must have been completed by your child's doctor anytime after 9/2/14. Please have completed Health Appraisal Forms returned to the Health Office as soon as possible. If your child is scheduled to have a physical, please contact my office to let me know when that will be done. I will be sending another round of reminder letters soon.





ABSENCES

Remember, whenever you keep your child home from school, please call me @ (585) 249-6607 in advance of the start of the school day and leave a detailed message of why your child will be absent.

OUTDOOR PLAY

With the cold weather upon us, parents please remember to have your child dressed for the weather. They should bring their fabulous five to school each and every day. Final decisions for outside play are frequently made shortly before recess when the temperature tends to be warmer than the beginning of the school day. Recess participation is a vital part of the well-rounded student and we want each of them to enjoy it in a safe and healthy manner.

HAS YOUR CHILD HAD HIS OR HER FLU SHOT YET? IF NOT, PLEASE READ BELOW

Would you like to have your child vaccinated against influenza during the school day? This flu season, **SKIPP** (School Kids Influenza Prevention Program) will give the same flu vaccine that your child would receive at the doctor's office in school!

SKIPP is a partnership between our school district, Monroe County Department of Public Health, and the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Rochester Medical Center. Our school has been selected to have a one-day flu clinic this flu season.

We think this is important because:

- Flu spreads rapidly through schools.
- Flu may cause fever, chills, headache, body aches and tiredness.
- Children may be sick for a week or more and miss a lot of school.
- Also, school children can spread the disease to babies and grandparents who may not be able to fight off the virus.



Upcoming Programs at Penfield Public Library



- Volunteers should honor all students as learners.

#### CONFIDENTIALITY STATEMENT

As we enter Harris Hill School as volunteers and employees, we will remember to respect the privacy of our children, their family, and each other. All that we hear, see, or read will remain confidential.

If you are volunteering, we ask that you remain in your volunteering location. To maintain a safe and secure environment, we will be minimizing the traffic of visitors throughout the building. Thank you for understanding and cooperation.

## Guidelines for Visitors Eating Lunch in the Harris Hill Cafeteria

Lunch is a time for children to interact with peers and develop social skills. If you choose to join us for lunch, it is important that you follow these guidelines:

- ♦ Always check in and out at the security desk.
- ◆ Cafeteria rules need to be followed at all times.
- Appropriate dress & language for an elementary school is always necessary.
- ♦ Food cannot be given to children other than your own.
- ◆Please say your goodbyes in the café, we are asking that you do not go back to the cluster after lunch.
- ◆ Recess is considered part of the school day and a necessary time for children to interact with peers. We are asking that visitors <u>not</u> join this independent play time.
