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# Message from the Nurse

#### **Change in Medication Administration in the Health Office**

Just a reminder that the District medication policy changed last February (2015). The Nurses in the District are no longer allowed to apply Vaseline, Calamine, Aloe and Unscented lotion, as well as administer cough drops or other OTC oral medications in the health office without a doctors order. In the past we were supported by a standing order from our District Physician to administer these things but the orders are no longer available to us and the New York State Education Department does not allow any medication, prescription or OTC (oral as well as topicals) to be administered without a doctors order. So, going forward if your child needs to have lotion for their dry skin, Vaseline for their chapped lips or a cough drop at school, I will need to have a doctor's order and this includes oral medications (prescription or OTC) as well. Last spring I sent home the District OTC Medication Administration form with every student, if you are in need of another copy please feel free to contact me . You can also find this form on the website, at <a href="www.penfield.edu">www.penfield.edu</a>. It is located under "quick links"- files and documents and then the Health Forms tab. Thank you for your patience in this matter.

Parents, please remember to notify the health office at <u>(585) 249-6607</u> if your child is going to be out of school for vacations, personal reasons, etc. as well as illness.

### **5th Grade Parents**

### **Scoliosis Screening:**

I started the New York State mandated Scoliosis Screening for 5th grade students the week of 02/22 during Physical Education Classes. If I have received a Health Appraisal form for your child for 5th grade AND the doctor has documented a scoliosis screening, your student will not be screened at school. If my findings are not within New York State guidelines, you will be notified and asked to take your child to your own physician for further examination.

#### **Immunization Requirement:**

Please be aware that according to New York State guidelines, all children entering 6th grade in September will need to have a shot for diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus (also called Tdap) as well as Varicella (Varivax which is the vaccine for chicken pox.) You will be receiving a notification letter from Bay Trail Health Office very soon. Please take the time to fill out this form and return it to Bay Trail Nurse's Office as soon as possible. Dear Parents/Guardians:

If you would like to request transportation to and from a Childcare/Alternate Site during the 2016-2017 school year, please fill out the attached "Transportation Form" and return it to the Transportation Department. A new form must be filled out each school year.

The deadline for requests is April 1, 2016.

\*\*FAXED AND EMAIL COPIES ARE NOW ACCEPTED. \*\*

A childcare location is defined as a place situated within the school district, other than the child's home, where care for less than 24 hours a day is provided on a regular basis. This definition includes, but not limited to, a variety of childcare services such as day care centers and in-home care by relatives and non-relatives. We will transport Penfield students to all public daycares located in the Penfield Central School District. Transportation to private daycares will also be provided if the private daycare is in the attendance zone of the school the child is attending.

An alternate site request would include students having dual residences.

We will transport to and from the primary residence, unless a Childcare/Alternate Site form is completed.

This form is critical to our route planning and your assistance in this process is greatly appreciated. Some additional information regarding the transportation of students to and from Childcare/Alternate Sites is included.

#### Transportation between School and a Child Care Location / Alternate Site

State Education Law authorizes a board of education, at its discretion, to provide transportation between school and Childcare/Alternate Sites in grades K-8. Such transportation may be provided only for children attending Childcare/Alternate Sites located within the district.

Children are eligible for transportation to or from a Childcare/Alternate Site and school when the distance exceeds ½ mile. Consequently, a child may be eligible for transportation to or from a Childcare/Alternate Site even though not eligible for transportation to or from home (if home was within ½ mile of the school).

The parent or legal guardian must submit a written request for transportation to or from a Childcare/Alternate Site before April 1st. Routes are developed based on this information. The Penfield School District Transportation Department will process these requests received after April 1st, as quickly as possible, but it may take up to ten (10) working days to put changes in place.

Childcare/Alternate Site requests will be processed adhering to the requirements of all-applicable Laws, Regulations, and District Policies. Wherever possible, assignment will be made to existing Bus Routes and Bus Stops. These Bus Stops will be located within ½ mile of the Childcare/Alternate Site as required by the Penfield School District Policy for students K-8.

While the Penfield School District Transportation Department will try to accommodate every legal request, we require a <u>written</u> form for any change in Childcare/Alternate Site transportation arrangements.

Please be sure to have plans in place in the event that your child needs to go home instead of to the Childcare/Alternate Site.

The District is not authorized to provide transportation between the Childcare/Alternate Site and the child's home. Transportation may be provided from the home address or Childcare/Alternate Site to school and from school to the home or Childcare/Alternate Site.


- Childcare/Alternate Site address must be located within the Penfield Central School District.



### Guidelines for Visitors/Volunteers at Harris Hill

The involvement of volunteers at Harris Hill, both on a regular and occasional basis, is valued by everyone as a VERY important part of the overall program. Whatever your skills or schedule, we appreciate your help. Please follow these guidelines:

- Always check in and out at the security desk.
- Please have an updated yellow district volunteer form on file annually.
- *Volunteers are expected to abide by district policies and regulations.*
- ♦ Appropriate dress & language for an elementary school is always necessary.
- Volunteers should honor all students as learners.

#### CONFIDENTIALITY STATEMENT

As we enter Harris Hill School as volunteers and employees, we will remember to respect the privacy of our children, their family, and each other. All that we hear, see, or read will remain confidential.

If you are volunteering, we ask that you remain in your volunteering location. To maintain a safe and secure environment, we will be minimizing the traffic of visitors throughout the building. Thank you for understanding and cooperation.

### Guidelines for Visitors Eating Lunch in the Harris Hill Cafeteria

Lunch is a time for children to interact with peers and develop social skills. If you choose to join us for lunch, it is important that you follow these guidelines:

- ♦ Always check in and out at the security desk.
- ◆ Cafeteria rules need to be followed at all times.
- Appropriate dress & language for an elementary school is always necessary.
- ♦ Food cannot be given to children other than your own.
- ◆Please say your goodbyes in the café, we are asking that you do not go back to the cluster after lunch.
- ◆ Recess is considered part of the school day and a necessary time for children to interact with peers. We are asking that visitors <u>not</u> join this independent play time.
