

Remaining Committed to the **Reduction of Trash in the Harris Hill Cafeteria!**

completed a productive year of learning and active of hard work and fun! On the fun side, both Juntives in the cafeteria. We remain committed in material from old clothing! our efforts to significantly reduce the amount of cafeteria trash that is sent to the landfill.

This year we have added the following recycling/conservation systems in our cafeteria:

- $\sqrt{}$ Collection of plastic knives, forks and spoons for recycling.
- Collection of plastic fruit cups and other plastic containers for recycling.
- $\sqrt{}$ Use of biodegradable trays instead of Styrofoam trays once a month. (We were able to purchase these trays from our budget supplied by the PTA.)

We also continue to collect juice pouches which are then shipped to Terracycle. Like last year, we earned points with each shipment of juice pouches and these points can then be redeemed as donations to various charitable and environmental organizations. The charity points that we have earned this year will be donated to the National Arbor Day Foundation (five trees planted in an American forest) and to Charity Water (a year's supply of water provided for five people). We are thrilled to be able to donate to such worthy causes!

DENTAL EXAMS

WARM WEATHER

Once again I want to stress the importance of the regular use of sun protection for your children. Children exposed to strong sun rays can do real damage to their skin that may not show up until the adult years. Now is the time to prevent needless skin damage.

I suggest the use of your physician suggested sunscreen or one with an SPF of 30 or higher

that contains either zinc oxide or titanium diox-As the academic year is drawing to a close, this ide as the main ingredient. I also encourage you to send your child in with a hat everyday. If your child is extremely fair skinned a light, airy long sleeve shirt that can be worn during long periods of exposure is another good idea.

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

2) Be Prepared–Plan ahead to deal with illness or injury

Dear Parents:

Just a few reminders as the weather turns warmer and we near the end of the school year.

- A student's dress, grooming and appearance shall:
 - Be safe, appropriate and not disrupt or interfere with the educational process
 - Not include hats/bandannas in school
 - Not include items that are vulgar, obscene, or degrade others' race, religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation or disability
 - Not promote and/or endorse the use of alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs and/or encourage other illegal or violent activities
 - Shorts and tops should be modest and appropriate no spaghetti straps or bare midriffs
 - The hem of shorts, skirts, dresses, and skorts should extend to the fingertips when the student is standing
 - Appropriate dress for outside recess in every season
- Open toe shoes and sandals are not to be worn while playing on the playground equipment. I encourage you to talk with your child about safety and encourage them to wear sneakers. Also, please remind students that from a health perspective, students should not be sharing shoes.
- It is recommended that toys of any type not be brought to school as so often they become misplaced and are therefore a source of terrible disappointment for youngsters. To prevent hurt feelings and conflicts, we also recommend that trading cards and other trading toys should remain at home.
- Although video game players, CD/DVD players, IPods/IPads, Nooks/Kindles, cell phones and radios may be used on a limited basis during the school day for educational purposes, and may be allowed on the school bus, we discourage them from being brought to school. Items of this nature will need to <u>remain in backpacks or lockers unless being used for educational purposes</u>.
- Sports equipment with the exception of baseball mitts (no balls) should not be brought from home. Use of this type of equipment during playtime could cause injuries to students.
